The Livery are pleased to let you know that we are offering a series of financial awards to help young people with their career aspirations. All the awards are by competitive open public competition with applications made through the website. Award related information can be found via the links and the QR code below. Once the closing dates have passed those applicants selected for the short lists will be notified and invited to an interview process. The detailed timeline of each award can also be found online.

The benefits of these prestigious awards include funding to assist with what individuals are already doing or to pay for extra courses or training to help personal development. There will be great opportunities to meet industry leaders and managers as well access to mentorship programmes and other events with Coachmakers and sponsors.

### THE AEROTRON SCHOLARSHIP

This award is to sponsor young aviation mechanics or technicians who wish to take their Part 66 engineer's licence, by providing funds to help them through their theory examinations.

### THE VICTOR GAUNTLET SCHOLARSHIP and THE ERIC 'WINKLE' BROWN SCHOLARSHIP

These two awards are for young people to learn or enhance their aviation engineering and maintenance fabrication skills, specifically to preserve and develop hands on practical skills. The funds may be awarded to an individual to take a course, to buy equipment, or to fund a person running a specialist course to train others, in the field of aircraft maintenance fabrication skills for modern or vintage aircraft.

### THE DE HAVILLAND SCHOLARSHIP

This award is for a young person who wishes to learn to fly on a DH 82a Tiger Moth Aircraft with the Cambridge Flying Group. The purpose of the award is to preserve classic aircraft operation and engineering. The award is not intended to support someone to train for a commercial pilot's licence.
